## Enagri goes Down Under

Richard Parker, development director for bioenergy at Renewables East adds, "I'm convinced the event will be of value to a lot of people since it is covering not only our own resource recovery project (energy from waste) but also the farming initiative from EEDA. I think though that because it is not a straightforward agenda people are 'missing it'."
